Poker Walk

What to Do:

Prior to the Event Day

- Coordinate lunch time with your manager and co-workers in order to participate any time between 11:00 and 1:00.
- Walking shoes are recommended for the event.

Day of Event:

- Come to the 7th floor of the parking garage.
- Check in at the sign up table before starting
 - o Event Assistant will record the starting time on the form.

Rules:

- Must walk the entire designated path which will be considered a lap.
- A maximum time limit of 15 minutes applies.
- Participants can walk as many laps as possible in their 15 minute time limit.
- Everyone will be able to walk at least 5 laps in order to receive 5 poker cards.
- After completing each lap, the participant will receive one poker card.
- Five completed laps will provide five cards which is required in order to reach an eligible poker hand.
- Each additional completed lap will allow the participant to turn in a card and draw another card in order to try for a better poker hand.
- Participants are not allowed to trade cards with other participants.
- After the participant is finished walking, they will turn in their final poker hand to the Event Assistant.
- The Event Assistant will record the quitting time to make sure they stayed in their 15 minute time frame.
- The Event Assistant will review the final poker hand, record to the form, and circle which qualifying Ranking Group the hand falls into**.
- If no winner exists for any of the designated prizes that prize(s) will be distributed into one or more of the next groups of prizes which will result in more overall winners.

Poker Hand Ranking - Groups

Ranking is basically consistent with standard poker rankings. Since 4 decks of cards are being used, it is possible to have multiples of the same rank and possible to have 5 of a kind. Obtaining hands in these rankings, qualify you for entries into drawings with great prizes. Drawings are based on

Group A 1 Prize \$100.00

• Royal Flush

Consists of an ace, king, queen, jack, ten, all in the same suit.

• Straight Flush

Five cards of the same suite in sequence – such as : $\blacklozenge J, \blacklozenge 10, \blacklozenge 9, \blacklozenge 8, \blacklozenge 7$

• Any Five of a Kind

Five cards of the same rank – such as five queens or five 3's.

Group B 1 Prize \$75.00

• Any Four of a Kind

Four cards of the same rank – such as four queens or four 3's. The fifth card can be anything (Q-Q-Q-Q-2)

• Any Full House

Three cards of one rank plus two cards of another rank – such as three 10's plus two 5's. (10-10-10-5-5)

Group C 2 Prizes \$50.00 each

• Any Flush

All five cards must be of the same suite such as all diamonds.

• Straight

Five cards of mixed suites in sequence – Q- J-10-9-8

• Three of a Kind

Three cards of the same rank – such as three jacks. The other two cards can be anything (J-J-J-5-2)

Group D 4 Prizes \$25.00 each

• Two Pair

Two cards of the same rank plus two cards of another rank—such as two 5's and two 6's. The fifth card can be anything (5-5-6-6-3)

• One Pair

Two cards of the same rank – such as two 4's. The other three cards can be anything (4-4-A-5-2)

Group E 5 Prizes \$10.00 each

• Any Five Cards
